Message from the Director General

Dear Members and Friends,

On August 9, 2016, The Reserve Bank of India in its latest policy measure kept key interest rates unchanged. The decision to hold the repo rate at 6.50 percent had been widely expected. First, the consumer inflation accelerated to 5.77 percent in June which is above RBI's target of 5 percent by March, 2017. Second, the rise was mainly driven by food, with vegetable inflation higher than the usual seasonal rise at this time of the year. Third, the Reserve Bank's latest industrial outlook survey suggests that capacity utilisation, seasonally adjusted, is still weak. However, the RBI study also shows the level of foreign exchange reserves rose to US\$ 365.7 billion by August 5, 2016 and the net portfolio flows were stronger after the Brexit vote. These facts suggest that the outlook for domestic economy is still mixed, with a positive bias.

In this backdrop, the Union Cabinet approved the GST Constitutional Amendment Bill on 27 July 2016. From the consumer point of view, the significant advantage of GST will be in terms of a reduction in the overall tax burden on goods, free movement of goods from one state to another without stopping at state borders for hours for payment of state tax or entry tax and reduction in paperwork to a large extent. These and several other advantages should boost business sentiment and eventually investment. The timely implementation of GST will be challenging, though.

Moreover, critics do argue that tax reforms should not be aimed only at increasing production. Instead, the reforms should be aimed at augmenting revenue to assure alleviation of poverty and creating a more equitable society. We should remember that India still ranks 130th in the Human Development Index of 2015. Without increasing the consumption power of a majority of the population, India cannot achieve **sustainable** economic growth. Hence, more such radical reforms are needed in the area of direct taxation too, which mainly concerns personal income tax of local entities.

Workshop on Internal Financial Controls

One of the widely discussed requirements of The Companies Act 2013 has been around Internal Financial Controls (IFC), with newer roles and accountabilities defined for the Board, Audit Committee, Statutory Auditors, and the Management. The Bombay Chamber organized a Workshop on Internal Financial Controls to facilitate its members to deal with the compliance related to IFC. The speaker at the Workshop was Mr. Tushar Nahar, Director, Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu India LLP. He addressed the participants on the IFC Framework, Risk, Control and Documentation, Implementing, maintaining and monitoring IFC and steps for ensuring effective oversight.

Workshop on Five S

Bombay Chamber organised customised training program for the staff member of Athena Drug Delivery Solutions Pvt Ltd. on" Five S "under its UKIERI project.5S is a structured housekeeping and workplace organization program which involved everybody in a work area. It will lead to a reduction in wasted time and effort, improved productivity, better safety, improved workforce engagement.

This 1-day workshop was facilitate by Mr. Vishal Chavan, Lloyd's Register, LRQA. He provided hands-on instruction on use of the 5-S System to simplify and organize the workplace and avoid the 7 wastes while increasing productivity. The course includes classroom instruction, where each of the 5-S components are explained in detail. Upon completion, participants move to the work area to focus on hands-on application of each component and real-life examples for applying 5-S methods.
