### Message from the Director General

Dear Members and Friends,

Robert Merton Solow, an American economist, who awarded the Nobel Memorial Prize in Economic Sciences in 1987 calculated that during sixties about four-fifths of the growth in US output per worker was attributable to technical progress. He argued, in the short run, growth is determined by moving to the new steady state which is created only from the change in the capital investment, labor force growth and depreciation rate but in the long run, growth is achievable only through technological progress. Today it is widely accepted that any sector of an economy - household, corporate or government-with access to the Internet has its own impact on better transparency on economic growth. While we have instances where IT has enhanced the effectiveness of ethics, good governance and quality of life in general, overall database measuring the extent of this is still to be developed for India.

As far as economic growth is concerned, on the domestic front, the Central Statistics Office (CSO) released its second advance estimates for 2016-17 on February 28. The growth in GDP during 2016-17 is estimated at 7.1 per cent as compared to the growth rate of 7.9 per cent in 2015-16. The sectors which are likely to register growth rate of over 7.0 percent are 'public administration, defense and other services', 'manufacturing' and 'trade, hotels, transport, communication and services related to broadcasting'. The growth in the 'agriculture, forestry and fishing', 'mining and quarrying', 'electricity, gas, water supply and other utility services', 'construction' and 'financial, real estate and professional services' is estimated to be 4.4 percent, 1.3 percent, 6.6 per cent, 3.1 percent and 6.5 percent respectively. The 'agriculture, forestry and fishing' sector is likely to show a growth of 4.4 per cent in its GVA during 2016-17, as against the previous year's growth rate of 0.8 per cent. However, for the same period, India's real GVA growth has been estimated at 6.7 per cent down from 7 per cent in the first advance estimates.

Chamber is also organizing Workshops on "Discover the Digital Leader in You", A Hands-On Workshop on Internet of Things (IOT), Workshop on "Emerging Technologies & The Next Wave of Business", Certificate Course on "Network Security, Penetration Testing & Cyber Forensics, etc." in coming months.

### **Chamber Happenings**

Interactive Session on 'Critical Issues Relating to GST' with Mr. Sumit Dutt Majumder, Former Chairman, CBEC

In view of the visit of Mr. Sumit Dutt Majumder, Former Chairman, CBEC to Mumbai, the Bombay Chamber took the initiative of organizing an Interactive Session on the `Critical Issues Relating to GST' on March 15, 2017 for the benefit of its members. Mr. Majumder detailed on the steps and rationale for introduction of GST and also addressed specific key issues such as Place of Supply Provisions, particularly those relating to Inter State Supply of Services, Invoice Matching Mechanism, GST Impact on Exports and SEZ, Tax Collection at Source (TCS) from e-commerce operators, concerns regarding Anti Profiteering measures.

#### Lecture on New Insider Trading Regulations of SEBI and Its Implications on M&A Transactions

The Bombay Chamber organized a lecture on the 'New Insider Trading Regulations of SEBI and its Implications on M&A Transactions' by Mr. Bharat Vasani, Chairman, Legal Affairs & IPR Committee, Bombay Chamber and Group General Counsel, Tata Sons Ltd. Mr. Vasani briefed on the issues related to definitions such as 'connected person', `generally available information', `insider', `promoter', 'securities', 'unpublished price sensitive information'. He also detailed on communication or procurement of unpublished price sensitive information, trading when in possession of unpublished price sensitive information, disclosure of trading by insiders and disclosure by other connected persons, codes on fair disclosure and conduct.

### Building Relationships Through Networking

Bombay Chamber organized the captioned training program under its UKIERI project. Ms. Vinee Ajmera, Founder, Personage Corp conducted the

session. The workshop was designed so as to facilitate participants to discover the significance of networking and to accept it as an important skill for the future. Relevant and engaging videos, anecdotes, exercises, games and role plays were used to achieve these objectives.
