# Mandated CSR for Eligible Companies

### For the Greater Good

#### A Formal Framework for Social Spending by Corporates

### From April 1, 2014

#### **HOW MUCH**

2% of average profit of previous three years

Profits from overseas branches and dividends from other cos not included in net profit for calculation

### WHO

Companies with net worth of over ₹500 crore or turnover of over ₹1,000 crore or net profit of over ₹5 crore

Foreign cos registered in India included

#### CSR activities will have to be within India



Company's board

CSR committee

#### WHAT ALL

Livelihood enhancement and rural development projects

Promoting preventive healthcare & sanitation

Measures for benefit of armed forces veterans, war widows and their dependents

#### Working towards protection of national heritage, art & culture

Reducing inequalities faced by socially & economically backwards

Protection of flora & fauna, animal welfare agro-forestry etc

#### DO'S AND DON'TS

Surplus from CSR cannot be included in profit

CSR work can be done through a registered trust or society or a separate co Co can collaborate with other cos but will have to report separately




### CSR Spend 2014-2020







### **CSR AMOUNT SPENT**



# **Reality Check**

CSR law set minimum standards, but did not create an impetus for positive action. Companies built "excellent" school infrastructure and met the legal requirement by spending money on education, but failed to ensure quality education

Issue of geographic equity in CSR spending across states.

Malpractices & Scams in CSR spending have been unearthed by the law enforcement agencies

More than 52 out of the country's 100 largest companies failed to spend the required 2% on CSR activities ( KPMG Report 2018)

Poor disclosure standards were followed by companies while explaining the details of their spending on the CSR initiatives.


Law did not define an enforcement mechanism or penalties for non-compliance

Politicization of CSR funds. Social Impact????

Companies justified their non-spending or underspending towards CSR activities by claiming that they have already spent the required amount while hiring personnel exclusively for implementing the CSR activities.

Mandated CSR remained largely voluntary, but gave the illusion of progress. India has ranked 117 out of 163 in Social Progress Index 2020
